<p>The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act is an unprecedented opportunity to revive the country's economy by saving and creating jobs and investing in transportation, infrastructure, fighting crime, energy, clean water systems, housing and human services. As of June 10, 2009 the City of Buffalo has secured approximately \$37.8 million in ARRA "stimulus" funding.</p>

Inner Harbor Streets (Lloyd, Hanover, Perry and Prime Slip)	NYS Department of Transportation	\$2,300,000	Construction of new cobblestone streets, granite curbs, sidewalks, lighting, landscaping, traffic signals and traffic protection
Sidewalks, Mill & Overlay	NYS Department of Transportation	\$1,600,000	Replacement of curbs and sidewalks as well as milling and overlaying select City streets in every Councilmatic district. Installation of striping, ADA compliant ramps and traffic signals as identified.
South Park Reconstruction	NYS Department of Transportation	\$500,000	Resurfacing of South Park Avenue from Bailey to Dorrance. Street lighting, landscaping, traffic signals, striping, enhanced crosswalks and streetscape.
